PEACE AND CONFLICT STUDIES CONCENTRATION

The Peace and Conflict Studies concentration is a multidisciplinary program for students who wish to complement their major field of study with courses focused on the causes of war and social conflict, and ways of preventing and ending them. The concentration combines in-depth study of one or more wars with an examination of common causes of conflict such as economic disparities and religious, ethnic, racial, or gender discrimination. It also demands engagement with moral and ethical questions about the circumstances under which the use of violence can be justified.

Requirements

To complete the concentration, a total of six courses is necessary from the lists below, representing at least three disciplines. Students can choose between two concentration tracks: Peace and Conflict Studies or Peace and Conflict Studies/Social Justice. Students must take at least one course in each of three categories listed below. No more than two courses from your other plan(s) of study may be counted toward your concentration. No more than two Study Abroad courses, with the director's permission, can be counted for concentration credit.
