CLASSICS MAJOR

Department Advanced Placement Policy

Students with AP credit in Latin may be placed in 300-level Latin courses but do not normally receive credit toward the major.

Requirements Available for Classes of 2025, 2026 and 2027:

A minimum of 10 courses is required for a major in Classics. Normally, majors take no fewer than eight courses in the original languages. Adjustments to the language requirements can be approved by the chair of the department.

Code Title

Language courses in both Greek and Latin. Select one of the following:

GREK 213 & GREK 214	Intermediate Greek 1 and Intermediate Greek 2 ¹
LATN 211 & LATN 214	1st Readings in College Latin and Intermediate Latin 2 (LATN 213 can be taken in place of LATN 211) ¹

LATN or GREK author courses numbered in the 300s. ²

Additional courses in the department to reach a minimum of 10 courses.

- Must complete language study through the intermediate level in one language (either Latin or Greek)
- Must complete language study at least through one semester of advanced courses in the second language.
- The course CLAS 100: Opening Classics is required for the Class of 2027

Requirements Available for Classes of 2025 and Onwards, and the only option for Class of 2028:

- · At least 11 courses, which include:
 - 3 CLAS Courses, with one being CLAS 100: Opening Classics
 - 3 courses in any one language offered by the Classics Department
 - 2 courses in any other one language offered by the Classics Department
 - · 3 other courses in the Classics Department
- At least one of the 11 courses above must be a material culture course
- At least one of the 11 courses above must be CLAS 201, GREK 301, or LATN 301
